INSTRUMENTS / ACCESSORIES

- 1. All school-owned instruments, including percussion, must be picked up at Pioneer in the Band Room (B126) on Monday, August 4. Repairs should be made before we leave Ann Arbor.
- 2. Woodwind (reed) players bring six good reeds.
- 3. Brass players bring a supply of oil.
- 4. Horns bring mutes (trumpets bring a straight mute).
- 5. PERCUSSIONISTS please note the following:
 - a. All VARSITY BAND students will play SNARE DRUM for marching at camp.
 - b. Percussionists must bring marching sticks.
 - c. The principal percussionist will contact all incoming percussionists to make sure they have all necessary equipment and to see that we bring enough snare drums, the correct assortment of concert mallets, and the appropriate equipment for our concert performance.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Should I take TWO instruments? YES! Feel free to take two instruments to Band Camp so you do not have to use your better instrument for marching. You WILL want to take your better instrument for concert work and auditions.

Should I bring a folding stand? YES! All students should bring a folding stand and clothes pins/clips for music make sure your name is on the stand!

Do I need a lyre for marching? NO, for Band Camp. YES for the school year; Concert and Symphony Band members, please have the appropriate lyre for your instrument **before school starts**.

When do I get my cabin assignment? You will receive Band Camp Bulletin No. 3, which includes cabin lists, daily schedules, etc., at check-in on Tuesday, August 5 @ 8:00 a.m. At least one adult counselor will be in charge of each cabin. *There will be no changes in cabin assignments.*

Can I meet you at Band Camp? YES! But, all students meeting us at camp must be sure all fees are paid and forms turned in beforehand. Band Camp t-shirts & Band Camp Bulletin #3 may be picked up at camp. Mr. Leach must be notified **in writing** that a student will not be riding the bus to camp.

Do I need any spending money? YES! If you are traveling by bus, bring \$20 — \$10 for lunch on the way to camp and \$10 for lunch on the way home. Bring additional money if you would like to buy snacks and/or souvenirs.

How do I get in shape for Band Camp? Marching is a very demanding physical activity, and your success and ability to enjoy this part of camp depends in a very large way on your pre-camp physical condition. Many members find running, biking, swimming, and climbing stairs very helpful. it is also important to sustain a daily exercise program throughout the summer to be prepared for the physically demanding marching season.

8:00 a.m. Students riding to camp on the bus should bring their instruments and luggage to Pioneer High School to be loaded on the bus. IN ADDITION TO YOUR INSTRUMENT(S), YOU WILL BE ALLOWED ONLY ONE SUITCASE AND ONE SLEEPING BAG. Be sure all items are clearly labeled with your name. Only instruments as large or larger than an alto sax or trumpet will be loaded beneath the bus or on an instrument truck—flutes, oboes and clarinets are to be carried on the bus. For safety, shoes must be worn at all times on the bus trips and at camp.
