The first months of 2006 continue to be remarkable for the Pioneer Bands. Thanks to your support, the 2006 Gala & Auction was an awesome success — approximately \$20,000 raised in support of our students in

need of scholarships for tour fees, band camp fees, private lessons, group lessons, instruments, music, and supplies. Thanks EVERYONE for a job well done!

We're so proud of what our students have accomplished during this, our 91st concert season: extraordinary performances at the District Solo and Ensemble Festival in January. In February, our Winter Concert performances from our small ensembles, the Jazz Band, the Varsity Band, the Concert Band, and the Symphony Band were incredible. The Jazz Band performed at the UM Jazz Festival, the Pioneer Bands Gala & Auction, and at The Firefly Club with the Paul Keller Orchestra during one astonishing weekend of jazz, with jazz band students learning what professional gigging really means. Right now, our student musicians are working hard for the Concert and Symphony Band performances at District Band Festival, hosted right here at Pioneer with the help of the PBA on March 11th.

March 25th and 26th are fast upon us: Saturday, March 25th is the date for both the State Solo and Ensemble Festival (held at Chelsea High School) AND our marvelous Ann Arbor Public Schools BANDS IN REVIEW concert. Varsity, Concert and Symphony Band members will perform at 7 pm on Saturday night along with all of the West side middle school groups and the Huron High School Symphony Band. On Sunday, March 26th at 3 pm, the Pioneer Symphony Band joins the East side middle schools and the Huron High School bands for a second Bands In Review concert. After the Sunday concert is our annual Incoming 9th Grade Band Family Orientation meeting (4:30 pm Sunday, March 26th in Schreiber) so if you know of a potential Pioneer bands student in 8th grade, get him/her to this meeting!

And it continues: In April, the Concert Band prepares for our tour to Toronto from April 27-30th. And then the year nears the end in May with our Band Banquet, our

BAND CAMP 2006 REGISTRATION

Band Camp at Interlochen

August 15-21 2006 **Band Camp Registration** takes place during the spring of the school year. Current Pioneer students receive the enrollment form from Mr. Leach or Ms. Waring in the classroom. Incoming 9th grade students receive the form when they audition for Mr. Leach at their middle school. Forms are also available at the Incoming 9th Grade Orientation meeting immediately following Band In Review. Forms and deposits can be returned to the directors in the classroom or mailed to the address provided on the form.

In order to notify Interlochen of our expected enrollment, the following deadline is enforced:

Monday, May 15th FOR ALL STUDENTS

Only a very limited number of openings for Band Camp may be available after the registration deadlines.

OR AT THE DISCRETION OF THE BAND DIRECTOR.

VARSITY BAND & CONCERT BAND UNIFORM TURN IN INFORMATION

Varsity Band uniform turn-in will be **Tuesday, March 28** during 1st and 3rd hours. Students should bring their uniforms to school with their name on them and hang them BEFORE SCHOOL STARTS on the racks that will be in the band room. The uniform committee will check them in during class, so any issues can be addressed with students during class time.

Concert Band uniform turn-in will be on **Wednesday, May 3** during 6th hour. Students should bring their uniforms to school with their name on them and hang them BEFORE LUNCH on the racks that will be in the band room. The uniform committee will check them in before 6th hour so we know about any issues beforehand and can address them during 6th hour.

2006-07 AUDITIONS

Participation in the Pioneer Bands is by audition only. Pioneer Band Auditions occur each March to determine placement in the Pioneer Band Program for the following school year. Once current students have been heard, incoming freshmen audition with Mr. Leach at their middle school. New and transfer students can request an audition with the Director once they enroll at Pioneer High School. Audition music is available from Mr. Leach or Ms. Waring.



WEST GERMAN RADIO SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA MEMBERS VISIT PIONEER

On October 13th, five members of this premier European orchestra visited Pioneer Symphony Band and offered sectionals for trumpet, French horn, and oboe, while a violinist worked with string players in the Symphony Orchestra. In each case the musicians were principal or associate principal on their instruments. The WDR Symphony Orchestra performed that evening in Hill Auditorium with Renee Fleming to a nearly sold-out house. The visit to Pioneer was organized by Samuel Rast's family: Samu's uncle, Mr. Ludwig Rast, is one of the orchestra's principal horn players. Although he was ill and had to cancel his own participation in the tour, he arranged for his friends and colleagues to offer sectionals to the students at Pioneer.

The WDR Symphony Orchestra was founded in 1947 and has its home in Cologne, Germany. Under conductor Symon Bychkov the orchestra has recorded a number of best-selling CDs, including Brahms and Shostakovich symphonies as well as a recent recording of Richard Strauss's *Daphne* with Renee Fleming, which they performed that evening at Hill.

The WDR Symphony Orchestra members were stunned and excited by the seriousness of the music programs at Pioneer and by the talent of the young musicians they taught. While both sides worked hard – the musicians testing out their English in an unfamiliar setting and the kids working mightily to learn as much as possible in the short hour – the visit also enabled a bit of cultural exchange. A couple of the kids tried out their German while the orchestra members had a chance to see a different aspect of the U.S. than is accessible through the media or American TV shows.

From Ann Arbor the 160 members of the WRD Orchestra, including the men's choral section and the tech staff, flew to Newark and then New York, where they performed *Daphne* in Carnegie Hall. Their tour closed in the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. Now that they are back home, they have written to let us know that Ann Arbor was the highpoint of their visit to the U.S. The personal insights they gained into music-in-themaking here left an enormously positive impression. We are fairly certain that some of them will show up in

SCHOOL BOARD PRESENTATION PART II

A committee of PBA members Janice Doyle, Denise Ten-Brink, Laurel Fingerle, and Jean Wedemeyer made a presentation to the School Board on February 22nd on the issue of inadequacies of the present band room, especially with regard to accessibility. Pioneer's Band Room hasn't had anything done to update the facilities in fifty years, and unless a wheelchair bound student plays first flute, B126 is an inaccessible space. The committee took measurements of Huron's current space and the band space in the new school, and requested that the district remove the risers in the band room to make it fully compliant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act. PHYSICAL EDUCATION WAIVER

When a Pioneer Band student has completed *TWO SEMESTERS* (Fall) of Symphony Marching Band **OR** *ONE SEMESTER* (Fall) of Symphony Marching Band **PLUS** TWO SEMESTERS (Fall) of Concert Band, he/she is eligible for a physical education waiver for ONE SEMESTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION CREDIT. The yellow **Verification & Authorization for Physical Education** forms are available on the table in the lobby of the Counseling Office, and requires the signature of the Director of Bands. Completed forms should be turned into the Counseling Office by May 1, 2006.



ROBERT ALBRITTON ENDOWMENT FUND

Former Pioneer High School Director of Bands Robert Albritton was the longest-serving Director of Bands at Pioneer High School — for over 20 years he exemplified the role of the band director as a leader, mentor, and lifelong friend to his students. During his tenure he moved the program forward with an ever-expanding itinerary of festival trips and concert appearances, culminating in the 2000 Symphony Band tour of China.

Through generous donations of band alumni and current band families, and with matching funds from the
