### YOU ARE ALL WONDERFUL!

There is always something happening in the Bands at Pioneer. Please pay close attention to this newsletter, attend curriculum (Capsule) night on September 19th, and parent-teacher conferences. Come to PBA meetings (the second Tuesday of each month in the PHS band room), and attend concerts. It is only through your active participation in your student's life that you will know what is happening. Your presence at your student's activities are extremely important. This is the best manner that we as parents can demonstrate our unconditional love and support for their activities. If you don't hear music at your house (from your child's instrument, not the radio) you and your child need to discuss if you as a parent are making a wise investment. Your student's instrument can run several hundred dollars. In addition, reeds, oils, lessons, all cost \$\$\$. Are you making a wise investment? Our assignments are learning our parts to proficiency. Don't be satisfied with your student telling you "I practiced before you got home"; encourage them to demonstrate their proficiency by playing their part for you.

In conclusion, I wish to thank you all for your time and the support of your child's decision to become a high school musician. Your active support and presence is priceless, and before you know it will all be over and they will be asking grandma and grandpa (you and the spouse) to baby sit so that they can have a little quality time.

### FALL 2005 PIONEER BANDS FUND RAISING EVENTS

**CAR WASH** Our annual Pioneer Bands Car Wash is scheduled for **Sunday, October 1**, from 8 am to 4 pm at the Pioneer High School parking lot. *Rain Date: October 2*. **All Pioneer Band Students (and band families!) participate.** Students take pledges from friends, relatives and neighbors for this annual fundraiser. Pledges are for an amount per car washed by the students. Donations are also accepted from those having their car washed. Make plans to get your grubby vehicles cleaned at the **October 1st Pioneer Bands Car Wash early and often!** 

**CANDY SALE** The Fall Candy Sale is the Pioneer Bands' annual MAJOR fund-raiser, and is our most consistently profitable fund raiser. *This year the sale begins September 13 and ends September 27.* The cooperation and understanding of all band parents with respect to this important activity is very much appreciated. Boxes of candy will be issued to each student to sell to friends and family. The students (and parents) are responsible for purchasing any candy that remains unsold. *It is best for parents to write one single check per student to turn in to Mr. Leach.* (*Checks are made payable to the PBA*).

**PTSO THRIFT SHOP** Parents and Students from the Pioneer Bands donate four hours of time per family at the PTSO Thrift Shop, and a portion of the proceeds are then awarded to the Pioneer Bands. Schedules are set up by the student and parent with the PTSO Thrift Shop (996-9155). It is important to set your schedule EARLY in the school year, as often there are too many workers! ### PBA ADVOCACY COMMITTEE

Pioneer High School Bands have always enjoyed strong support from parents, families, alumni, and the Ann Arbor community as a whole. Our PBA Advocacy Committee channels that support. The committee is dedicated to making and sustaining contact among Pioneer High School band families, with the School Board, and with the music faculty, students, and families in the middle and elementary schools in the Pioneer attendance area. Parents, students, alumni and friends of the Pioneer Bands are all invited to join the Advocacy Committee. Please e-mail Gail Stout at president@aapioneerbands.org, or join us at a Band Association meeting! Making connections among Band families: To facilitate connections among band families, the Advocacy Committee helps out with the band directory and sets up a phone tree for Symphony, Concert, Varsity, and Jazz Bands. The committee is seeking 30 volunteers from among these bands who would each be willing to telephone or e-mail no more than eight to ten other families to remind them of Band Association meetings, concerts, and other social events. In the spring, a few of these volunteers would also be asked to contact a small group of incoming freshmen to welcome them to our band family. *Making connections* with the School Board: In September, a group of Pioneer band members will speak during the public commentary portion of the School Board meeting. Band members will describe their experiences both at summer band camp and within the total band program and will thank the Board for all of their support. Making connections in the elementary and middle schools: The Advocacy Committee is committed to forging ties with the elementary and middle school teachers, students, and families in the Pioneer attendance area. In the coming year, the Advocacy Committee hopes to send small groups of musicians into these schools to talk about Pioneer Bands and to perform excerpts from their solo and ensemble pieces.

### **PBA FUNDING COMMITTEE**

Maintaining funds for a large organization like this can be a daunting task but with the help of every family we will remain the strong supportive group that we strive to be. Our traditional fundraisers in the past few years have included a yearly car wash and candy sale as well as volunteering time in the PTSO Thrift shop. Money is also raised year round through apparel and CD sales. Finally, the **Robert Albritton Endowment Fund** serves as a long term fund that will help band students enrich their band experiences outside of the school curriculum.

Our **CAR WASH** is a fun event in the fall where bands members collect pledges and donations and then wash as many cars as they can on car wash day. This is a great social event where freshmen can get to know other band members and everyone has a great time. The **CANDY SALE** starts in September. Finally the PTSO Thrift Shop operates year round. Band members and their families donate their time (usually 4 hours per year) to stock and maintain the shop and the hourly wage is paid to the Pioneer Band. Since many school organizations use this as a funding mechanism it is strongly encouraged that families call early in the school year to book their time. Time slots fill up quickly.

As a final note, the funding committee is actively looking for interested band parents to help re-evaluate our current fundraisers and/or research new ones. Please join us in making this a fun and productive year!
