Thanks EVERYONE for a job well done! We're so proud of what our students have accomplished during this, our 92nd concert season: extraordinary performances at the District Solo and Ensemble Festival in February. Also in February, our Winter Concert performances from our small ensembles, the Jazz Band, the Varsity Band, the Concert Band, and the Symphony Band were incredible. The Jazz Band performed at the UM Jazz Festival, and the Pioneer Bands Gala & Auction, during one astonishing weekend of jazz, with jazz band students learning what professional gigging really means. Right now, our student musicians are working hard for the Concert and Symphony Band performances at District Band Festival, hosted right here at Pioneer with the help of the PBA on March 10th.

And it continues: The year nears the end in May with our Band Banquet, our performances at Picnic Pops on the Pioneer front lawn, the Jazz Band performs at the Jazz Summit, and the Symphony Band has the pleasure of playing for the Pioneer Commencement ceremonies at the EMU Convocation Center in June. # PHYSICAL EDUCATION WAIVER

When a Pioneer Band student has completed TWO SEMESTERS (Fall) of Symphony Marching Band OR ONE SEMESTER (Fall) of Symphony Marching Band PLUS TWO SEMESTERS (Fall) of Concert Band, he/she is eligible for a physical education waiver for ONE SEMESTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION CREDIT. The VERIFICATION & AUTHORIZATION FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION FORMS are available on the table in the lobby of the Counseling Office, and requires the signature of the Director of Bands. Completed forms should be turned into the Counseling Office by May 1, 2007.

# ROBERT ALBRITTON ENDOWMENT FUND

Former Pioneer High School Director of Bands Robert Albritton was the longest-serving Director of Bands at Pioneer High School — for over 20 years he exemplified the role of the band director as a leader, mentor, and lifelong friend to his students. "Really Simple Syndication" (RSS) is an increasingly popular internet service that lets users decide what kind of information they get from the web. "Feeds" are really nothing more than regular updates of changing web content. New browsers like Internet Explorer 7 have made feeds easier to use. Millions of site content providers (including The New York Times, PBS, U of M, and local news stations.) currently offer RSS feeds, and now the Pioneer Band Association is proud to be able to offer them, too.

Maybe you have noticed the new Subscribe link and the rss button under the "News" heading in the right hand side of our web pages. The Subscribe link takes you to a page that explains a bit about this technology and explains different options for using it. This page also gives you options for subscribing, either to a general feed that covers all of our Pioneer Band news, or to more specific feeds by category or band. The rss button takes you right to our general feed subscription page.

For some of you, this new feature of ours is a simple convenience because web feeds and blogging are already part of your daily life. For others it will take a little more work to wrap your head around what seems seem like a new twist on e-mail. For still others, this may seem a bit daunting at first glance if you aren't the type who jumps right in to all the latest high tech features of web browsers and search engines.

Subscribing is easy, it's free, and it lets you call the shots. Subscribe to our any of our RSS feeds and you'll be the first to know whenever new announcements are posted to the website. Use this new feature at your own pace. Maybe we've peaked your curiosity and this will be your first venture into "Really Simple Syndication." If you are a band parent, there is a good chance your student already knows all about this "feed" stuff and is willing to help you get started.

# **PTO Thrift Shop**

If you have already worked your four hours at the PTO Thrift Shop toward the Band program, or if you've sent in a check for \$40 (in place of working) to the PBA Treasurer, THANK YOU!! If all Band families do their part, we will earn almost \$10,000 for the Pioneer Band program!

If you haven't had the chance to work yet, there's still time. Band students and/or parents can work. Sign-up is pretty painless: Requests for working in April can be turned in at the Thrift Shop any time between now and Saturday, March 3rd. Simply put your name and phone number, along with the hours you are available to work for each week, on a piece of paper. You then turn it in to the "employee area" at the Thrift Shop.

On March 4th, the manager will draw out the request sheets by lottery and assign hours for April accordingly. Someone from the Thrift Shop will then call you if you have been assigned time slots to work.

Remember, after the first four hours you work, you can earn money to be applied toward Band Camp 2007 tuition! (Since the payout for April won't be until September, the money would come to you in September as reimbursement for money that you will already have paid for Band Camp. Any hours worked before the end of February will be used to offset part of your cost for Band Camp.)
