This enjoyable evening will include a buffet-style hors d'oeuvre reception, live and silent auctions and special performances representing our Grammy Award-Winning Band Program.

We are hard at work gathering auction items and cash donations from local businesses. Our goal for the auction is to raise \$35,000. This is an ambitious goal, but the support of our Band Families will help us meet this goal and raise the funds to support our students. You can make a difference and add something unique to the evening.

We would like families to select a theme and put together a "Family Affair Basket." Be as imaginative and resourceful as you like. Your theme may reflect your family's personal interests. (If you can't think of a theme, we have included some suggestions on the back.) You need not limit your package to a "basket" – you may be creative in your packaging. You may get together with other families, or sections may work as a team, to assemble your theme baskets. All items should be new, non-perishable, and attractively packaged. If you chose to wrap your package, please use clear wrapping.

All participating families will be recognized in the program brochure and listed on the auction item itself. Then, all the "Family Affair Baskets" will be auctioned off during the evening. (The "Family Affair" baskets at last year's auction greatly contributed to the success of the evening.) Participation in the Family Affair Basket program is optional; however, we encourage all families to be involved and participate in this event. This is a fun way for families to get together, be creative, and help us raise funds for the Pioneer Bands.

The success of the band program, however, would not have been possible without family support. As we continue to strive for excellence, we are always thankful to our wonderful band families.

We encourage you to use your collective family imagination, inspiration and flair when coming up with a theme. (Think about what you might bid on.) But, if you are having difficulty, here are a few ideas for themes that have been used and items that may be included in the packages:

Romantic Evening: Special dinner items, wine, wine glasses, romantic music, and chocolates.

<u>Pioneer Pride:</u> A Pioneer sweatshirt, lanyard, seat cushion, and other purple & white items, packaged in a laundry basket.

<u>Coffee Break Theme</u>: A coffee maker, mugs, gourmet coffees, syrups and fancy spoons. (Could also be adapted for tea, wine, or other beverages.)

<u>Breakfast Extravaganza:</u> Gourmet pancake, waffle and muffin mixes, spatulas, pure maple syrup, fancy honeys, and pancake molds.

Family Game Night: Board games, cards, and a CD of background music.

<u>Luxury Bath Package:</u> Bath salts, bubble bath, foot scrubber, exfoliating sponge, eye mask, soaps, a facial treatment and scented candle, packaged on a bath tray.

<u>Viva Italy - Theme Celebrating Italian Food</u>: Pasta, sauces, biscotti, extra virgin olive oil, and chocolates. (Could also be adapted to food of other countries, regions or states.)

Things you may want to consider including in your package: gift cards or certificates, tickets to an event, small appliances, unique items, and items signed by celebrities (books, baseballs, hockey sticks, etc.) Last year theatre/concert tickets and dinners were our best sellers.
