It was great to meet so many of you at Capsule Night, our band picnic and Parent Conferences!

Chair auditions for Varsity Band will take place in early November. They will be during class. There is only one audition per year. All students know what is expected and should be preparing their music.

Our first full rehearsal for the Varsity Band will be on Wednesday December 5th from 6 to 8 PM. Attendance is required and grades will be lowered if a student is not there. If there is a sports conflict (please see the music/sports policy) we need to be told in writing asap. I am really looking forward to putting both halves of the band together. We have only have a few evening rehearsals before our Winter Concert. It is crucial that all students plan to attend. Please check your band calendar for specific dates.

Auditions for Concert and Symphony Bands are the first week of March. The music has been available since August. It is not something that we rehearse during class so students need to be working on that on their own during their nightly half hour of practice.

Reminder that all students need to have their names on their instruments (both inside and outside the case). Luggage tags work well for this, even if they are using one of our school instruments. Students have been advised to never leave their instrument in their hall lockers. We have a storage area in the band room for this purpose.

DONATION/SOLICITATION COMMITTEE

Responsibilities: Collecting donations of auction items and program advertisement purchases by:

- 1. Merchant and Business Contacts
 - Involves follow-up on letters sent out to area businesses. May involve in-person and/or telephone contact; and/or
- 2. Work with Community Connections
 - Work with any contacts you may have in the community to obtain auction items or donations.

When: October to January

Time Commitment: You determine your level of involvement. We have many businesses to contact. You can choose geographic area and number of businesses you wish to contact. An information packet will be provided.

When: Mid-January to Early-February

Time Commitment: 2-3 days, evenings or weekend afternoons

AUCTION BOOK PRODUCTION

Responsibilities: Formatting the auction book for the printers. Familiarity with Microsoft Publisher and PDF documents a plus, and computer access is necessary. Will work under guidance of band parent who has previously put together book.

When: January to early February.

Time Commitment: May vary, but can work around your schedule.

GALA & AUCTION POSITIONS:

The following volunteer opportunities are available the day of the event:

- $1. \ Transportation: Transport \ baskets \ from \ collection \ location \ to \ hotel \ (early \ afternoon-1-1½ \ hours \ commitment)$
- 2. Decorating and Set-Up: Involves setting up auction tables, displays and decorations (2-2½ hours commitment)
- 3. Check-In: Check-in event attendees and distribute programs and bidder numbers (2 shifts, 1 hour each)
- 4. Silent Auction Volunteers: Monitor silent auction tables during auctions, record winning bids, and assist winning bidders in collecting items. (4 shifts, 1 hour each)
- 5. Live Auction Recorders: record winning live auction bids as directed by auctioneer (1½ hours time commitment)
- 6. Check-Out: Collect payment for auction purchases (3 shifts, 1 hour each)
- 7. Clean-Up: Take down and put away decorations (approx 1 hour post-event time commitment)

PTO Thrift Shop News!

Wondering how you are going to finance that trip to NYC or Band Camp? Volunteer at the Thrift Shop! It's easy- just stop by the shop and sign up for a 2 hour shift. Sign-ups are available for the next month on a "rolling calendar". This means that there is always at least 30 days available to sign up for, based on availablility. A whole new week is posted each MONDAY MORNING, not on Sunday as previously reported.

Also, if you haven't heard, the shop is trying out a new program called "Music and Munchies". This is yet another way students can earn Thrift Shop hours. They have invited students to sign up to play live music for their customers. Each soloist/ensemble will play for 40-45 minutes. Each student will earn 2 hours of Thrift Shop time. The first program is being held on December 1st. If you didn't get a chance to sign up, stop in on the 1st to check it out. Rumor is, if the first one is successful, they will continue to offer it. What great news for all our fine student musicians and a great opportunity for them to perform for the public!!
