What a year so far!!! Marching season is far behind us and we have begun the plunge into concert season. The third weekend in January, at the Michigan Music Conference in Grand

Rapids, the **Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association** celebrated its 75th anniversary. As part of that celebration, four small ensembles were given a special invitation to perform as part of this celebration. These special ensembles represent the very best young musicians the State of Michigan has to offer. As stated on the Michigan Youth Arts council Web-site, the selection process is very challenging as they "attempt to discover unusually musically gifted high school students through rigorous competition, beginning in the local school and progressing through successive levels to the state". Having been selected from over 10,000 events, entered state-wide, is the highlight of any high school musician's career and the program from which they come. It gives me great pride to congratulate Pioneer's own "Kobashi Piano Trio", on being selected and having performed during the 75th anniversary celebration.

Right after that was the **District Solo & Ensemble** on January 17th at Livonia Franklin High School. Pioneer High School Music Department sent 249 students to this event!!! Pioneer Band students received 124 first division and 27 second division ratings in SOLO competition. As well as 130 first division and 14 second division ratings in ENSEMBLE competition. Students throughout the state performed in this state-qualifying event.

Immediately after that was the Pioneer Winter Concert. What an amazing night of music. A special thanks to **Jeffery Zook** and **Nancy Ambrose-King** for making this night unforgettable for all in attendance.

PTSO Thrift Shop News

There has been a new IRS ruling put into place regarding volunteer hours and monies earned at the shop. The Board of Directors of the Ann Arbor PTO thrift Shop has issued the following statement.

"As of January 1, 2009, all parents and high school age students of PTO'S, booster clubs, and school activities of participating AA Public Schools, may volunteer in the AAPTO Thrift Shop to benefit those clubs and activities for which they are working, but only if all the monies earned through volunteer hours are distributed equally amongst all students in that club or activity.

All monies earned are to benefit the group as a whole and not an individual student."

This news was just received during the mid winter break. The Thrift Shop has been notifying individuals by phone, usually on the day prior to their scheduled shift, to explain the ruling and to state that they do not have to work their shift if they no longer wish to do so. This comes as a devastating blow to those families who depend on the Thrift Shop monies to finance their band fees. Student and their families can still work to earn fund raising dollars for the General Band Fund. More information will be forthcoming once the band directors and PBA officers have had a chance to review the ruling.


There are a couple of reminders for volunteers. All students must now have a work permit to volunteer at the shop. Permits are available at the Thrift Shop or at the school office. The permits at the Thrift Shop need to be taken to the school office for approval and then returned to the Thrift Shop. The permits at the school must be taken to the Thrift Shop, back to the school office for approval, and then returned to the shop. All new volunteers must attend an orientation before beginning to work at the Thrift Shop. Please call the Thrift Shop for upcoming dates.

The Thrift Shop continues to pay out at the rate of \$8/hour. The next payout date is May 1st, 2009.

Thank you to all who work, shop, and donate. The shop still needs your support as they do pay out money to all the PTO'S in the district.

Former Pioneer High School Director of Bands, **Robert Albritton**, was the longest-serving Director of Bands at Pioneer High School — for over 20 years he exemplified the role of the band director as a leader, mentor, and lifelong friend to his students. During his tenure he moved the program forward with an ever-expanding itinerary of festival trips and concert appearances, culminating in the 2000 Symphony Band tour of China.
