Our assignment is to learn our parts. Don't be satisfied with your child telling you "I practiced before you got home". Encourage them to demonstrate their proficiency by playing their parts for you. In conclusion, I wish to thank you all for your time and your support of your child's decision to become a high school musician. Your active support and presence is priceless. Before you know, it will all be over and they will be asking grandma and grandpa (you and your spouse) to baby-sit so that they can have a little quality time.

I am really looking forward to working with this year's Varsity Band. I have been very impressed with the students so far. They have wonderful attitudes and are helpful and eager to learn. We're currently working on a brief marching band unit. Although the Varsity Band students won't march in any games I feel that it's important that they get a taste of what they will do if they want to move up to Concert and Symphony Band. It was great to see them sup-

porting the marching band at Wagongate!

While the students are outside marching our band librarians are preparing their music and folders so we can hit the ground running. We will be starting our inside concert rehearsals soon. Each student should be making sure that they are doing their nightly half hour of practice. They have also been told that they need to have their names on their instruments (both inside and outside), even if they are using one of our school instruments. Luggage tags work well for this. Students have been advised to never leave their instrument in their hall lockers. We have a storage area in the band room for this purpose.

Chair tryouts will be in late October or November. All students will play scales plus the most difficult areas of their concert pieces. All wind players will audition on the first parts for their instrument. Percussion will have additional requirements. There is only one chair tryout during the year so make sure that your child is practicing ahead.

Looking for a way to earn \$\$\$ to fulfill your General Band Fund obligation? Try volunteering at the PTO Thrift Shop!

Students or their parents may sign up to work 2 hour shifts. Volunteers usually earn \$8 an hour. The shop has a "rolling sign-up" system in place. Each Monday morning, a new week is added to the sign-up book. Stop by early to get the best selection.

All students age 14-17 must obtain a work permit to volunteer at the store. Students can obtain a permit at the school office or at the store. New volunteers are required to attend an orientation session before working their first shift. Email the volunteer coordinator at volunteer@a2ptothriftshop.org to sign up for a session. The session lasts about 1.5 hours and that time will be included in your paid hours. Payout dates are Sept. 1st, Jan 1st, and May 1st.

Volunteer are always needed and appreciated. If you haven't tried it yet, give it a whirl, you might love it!

- *Senior Activities makes sure that special event is planned and memorabilia is provided for graduating seniors. (Parent of a junior preferred.)

*Webmaster – responsible for keeping Pioneer Bands web site up to date and functioning properly.


