## Now for the fun stuff!

On Thursday May 26<sup>th</sup> the Music Department of Pioneer High School will be presenting a special concert celebrating our national success. Created in 1998, the GRAMMY Signature Schools program recognizes top U.S. public high schools that are making an outstanding commitment to music education during an academic school year.

This year will see the largest number of GRAMMY Signature Schools awards presented. Thirty-six public high schools in communities across the United States will receive this recognition. Each of the thirty-six GRAMMY Signature Schools will receive a custom award and a monetary grant to benefit its music program. The top seven schools are designated Gold recipients. The best of the Gold recipients is named the National GRAMMY Signature School. The National GRAMMY Signature School will receive \$15,000, and the six remaining Gold schools each will receive \$5,500. The two remaining GRAMMY Signature Schools recipients will receive a grant award of \$2,500 to benefit their music programs.

To the family, friends, and alumni who made this journey in 2006 (the last time Pioneer was awarded the National GRAMMY award) the experience and performance was the one of the greatest moments and musical experience in their life. Parents, thank-you so very much for supporting your child's decision to be a Pioneer musician, your faith doesn't go unnoticed or unappreciated. To this year's senior class you have insured that this will be a "year to remember" in the Pioneer Bands rich history!

Thanks and Appreciation to everyone who made the end of another school year and our band camp so successful.

There is always something happening in the Bands at PHS. Please pay close attention to this newsletter, check-out the Pioneer Bands Web-site and come to PBA meetings (the second Tuesday of each month in the PHS band room). Make it a family priority to regularly attend concerts. It is only

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through your active participation in your child's life that you will know what is happening. Your presences at your child's activities are extremely important. This is the best manner that we as parents can demonstrate our unconditional love and support for their activities. If you don't hear the music at your house (from your child's instrument, not the radio) you and your child need to discuss if you as a parent are making a wise investment. Your child's instrument can run several hundred dollars. In addition, reeds, oils, lessons, all cost \$\$\$\$

In Math, Science, English, your child is expected to complete assignments and Band is no different. Our assignments are our parts. Don't be satisfied with your child telling you "I practiced before you got home"; encourage them to demonstrate their proficiency by playing their part for you.

Your active support and presence is priceless, and before you know it will all be over and they will be asking grandma and grandpa (you and the spouse) to baby sit so that they can have a little quality time.



- You may also bring your donation to the event on the 21st, beginning at 9:30am Drop off your pop at the Ring Toss area.


