Solo & Ensemble forms were due Thursday, October 28th. Symphony and Concert Band members are required to participate and Varsity Band members are **STRONGLY** encouraged to participate. Solo & Ensemble makes a great practice run to audition for one of the other bands at Pioneer.

Solo & Ensemble Festival is January 15, 2011.

In conclusion, I wish to thank you all for your time and support of your child's decision to become a high school musician. Your active support and presence is priceless!

It was great to meet so many of you at Capsule Night, the band picnic and Parent Conferences!

Chair auditions for Varsity Band will take place in early November. They will be during class. There is only one audition per year. All students know what is expected and should be preparing their music.

Our first full rehearsal for the Varsity Band will be on Wednesday December 1st from 6 to 8 PM. Attendance is required and grades will be lowered if a student is not there. If there is a sports conflict (please see the music/sports policy) we need to be told in writing asap. I am really looking forward to putting both halves of the band together. We have only have a few evening rehearsals before our Winter Concert. It is crucial that all students plan to attend. Please check your band calendar for specific dates.

Auditions for Concert and Symphony Bands are the first week of March. The music has been available since August. It is not something that we rehearse during class so students need to be working on that on their own during their nightly half hour of practice.

Reminder that all students need to have their names on their instruments. Luggage tags work well for this, even if they are using one of our school instruments. Students have been advised to never leave their instrument in their hall lockers. We have a storage area in the band room for this purpose.

Although I direct the Varsity Band, the foundation of our program, I also work with every other band group at Pioneer. If you have any questions or concerns along the way please get in touch with me. PTO Thrift Shop News

Unfortunately, due to IRS regulations, the PTO Thrift Shop is no longer utilizing volunteer labor, and it is no longer possible to earn credits in this way. However, there remain multiple ways in which the PBA can continue to participate in fundraising through the PTO Thrift Shop.

We will continue to participate in the “Show Your Support” program, in which the Pioneer Bands display a poster at the Thrift Shop and compete with 2 other posters to obtain the most “tokens”. Tokens are earned by Thrift Shop shoppers at a rate of one token per \$5 spent. These tokens are then used to vote for one of the 3 posters/organizations on display. The organization receiving the most votes/tokens receives the largest dollar award. Our week to participate will likely be January 2-8, 2011 — watch your email or the band website for more information.

We will also participate in the “Music and Munchies” program, possibly in February or March 2011. Small musician groups will be needed to perform in one-hour shifts on a particular Sunday at the Thrift Shop, as well as the contribution of “Munchies” for the event. More information will be forthcoming—again, watch your e-mail or the band website.

We are continuing to explore other ways in which the PTO Thrift Shop can help us reach our fundraising goals! As always, contributions of used clothing and other items to the Thrift Shop benefit all Ann Arbor Public Schools and students.

Theater/concert tickets and dinners are often best sellers, and “experiences” are very popular – a gourmet cooking lesson, for instance. But remember, all items should be new, non-perishable, and attractively packaged using clear wrapping material.

So whether you’re “crafty” and enjoy the creativity of putting together a basket, or feeling time-crunched and would simply like to donate a gift card or a bottle of wine, we are grateful to our wonderful band families for their continued support. Thank you!
